

Knitting Plane Pattern

Plane Body

Make two of these, and then sew them together- stuffing as you go.

Cast on 3 stitches

Row 1) K3

Row 2) K1 f&b, k1, k1 f&b. (*5 stitches*)

Row 3) to 6) K5

Row 7) Cast on 5 sts, k10.

Row 8) Cast on 5 sts, k15.

Row 9) to 12) K15

Row 13) Cast off 5 sts, k10.

Row 14) Cast off 5 sts, k5.

Row 15) to 17) K5

Row 18) K1 f&b, k3, k1 f&b. (*7 stitches*)

Row 19) to 21) K7

Row 22) K1 f&b, k5, k1 f&b. (*9 stitches*)

Row 23) to 33) K9

Row 34) Cast on 10 sts, k19.

Row 35) Cast on 10 sts, k29.

Row 36) to 44) K29

Row 45) Cast off 9 sts, k20.

Row 46) Cast off 9 sts, k11.

Row 47) K11

Row 48) K9, k2tog.

Row 49) K8, k2tog.

Row 50) K7, k2tog.

Row 51) K6, k2tog.

Row 52) K5, k2tog.

Row 53) K4, k2tog.

Row 54) K3, k2tog.

Row 55) K2, k2tog.

Row 56) K1, k2tog.

Cast off.

Propeller

Cast on 15 stitches.

Rows 1) to 7) Knit all stitches.

Cast off.

Fold your rectangle in half length ways and sew sides together.

Sew the propeller to the nose of your plane. Add a button if you want :)

K – knit

sts – stitches

k2tog – knit two stitches together. 1 stitch decreased.

k1 f&b – knit up into the front of your stitch, but don't slip it off your left needle yet, and then knit down into the back of the same stitch, slip the stitch you've been working into off the left needle. 1 stitch increased.
